**SUBJECT:** Report of the Activities of the Inter-university Consortium for Political Research, California State Colleges and Universities Utilization During the 1972-73 Academic Year.

On July 1, 1972 the California State Colleges and Universities acquired a system-wide membership in the Inter-university Consortium for Political Research. This report is a summary of our first year's utilization of the resources that we thereby acquired.

The Inter-university Consortium for Political Research (ICPR) is headquartered on the University of Michigan campus and serves needs of social scientists who rely on quantified data, statistical analyses, and computer techniques in the classroom as well as in student and faculty research. ICPR has a subscribing membership of about 150 American Colleges and Universities as well as a growing number of Canadian and European members. CSUC was the first institution to develop a multi-institutional, system-wide membership, and our experience is providing a model for others. The State University of New York is the first to have followed the CSUC model, and several others, including the University of California, have consulted with us and are attempting to form a similar membership.

The ICPR, CSUC Council has viewed this first year of our membership as one in which we are attempting to develop curricular materials and are distributing information on the local campus as well as providing workshops and seminars for faculty who are interested in bringing these newer approaches and innovative techniques to their students. In this first year, however, there have been a large number of classes that have put to immediate use in the classroom the data we have acquired as well as other materials available on each campus. (See Appendix I for a detailed list.) Furthermore, representatives at each of the campuses anticipate a rapid increase in the number of classes in which these resources will provide an important experience for students. This expectation is supported by comments given us by many of the participants in the four faculty workshop/seminars that have been run this year. (See Appendix II.) These were open to faculty at all of the nineteen campuses, and representatives from eighteen of these campuses did attend. The department affiliations represented by these participants are broad and include all of the social sciences as well as several

other fields of teaching. (These are listed in Appendix II.)

The ICPR, CSUC Council is composed of one representative from each campus, one representative from the Division of Information Systems, and one from the Division of Academic Program and Resource Planning. The Council met four times during the academic year 1972-73. These meetings were attended by at least sixteen members each time, and all nineteen campuses were represented during the year. It provided an unusual opportunity for system-wide cooperation in generating innovative proposals for curricular development. Our second year is one that we expect to be even more productive than this first. Our tentative plans include: development of printed curricular modules, a summer workshop for faculty and students, and short workshop/seminars on each campus that will be run by the council member on that campus. Furthermore, many materials have been developed this past year which will be used during the 1973-74 academic year. Thus, ICPR, CSUC has provided an important resource that is having a major impact on pedagogical approaches.
