4th annual report

The Inter-University Consortium for Political and Social Research (hereafter referred to as ICPSR) is a working relationship between more than two hundred American colleges and universities as well as some Canadian and European members. It is headquartered on the University of Michigan campus. On July 1, 1972, the California State Colleges and Universities acquired a system-wide membership in the ICPSR and in 1976 costs were included as a line item in the budget. The ICPSR collects (from researchers) and distributes significant historical, social, economic and political studies. Additionally, software is developed for the use of this data in classroom teaching (student learning modules) and computer analysis (programming and documentation). ICPSR also provides and subsidizes post-doctoral training and an annual summer program in Ann Arbor for instructors and students. ICPSR thus serves to aid in development of student skills, faculty development and curriculum growth and development.

USAGE

During the first year of our membership, ICPSR materials were used in 65 classes, in 15 graduate student projects and 18 faculty projects on 15 campuses in the CSUC system. By the spring of 1975 a total of 110 individual classes on all 19 campuses were incorporating ICPSR materials into their curriculum.

(The 1975-76 class usage along with 1972-73 and 1974-75 is in Appendix 1.)

This usage report is rather conservative because of the increasing number of areas using ICPSR materials and due to the fact that many users never formally report their use to TCSUC-ICPSR Council members. For example, ICPSR data sets include relatively current national opinion polls and election studies which are used as resource material for lectures. This type of usage is seldom reported. Initially, most usage was by political scientists but now a wide range of academic areas report using ICPSR materials.

SUMMARY OF 1975-76 ACTIVITIES

(1) Three TCSUC-ICPSR Council meetings were held. There is one representative from each school on this council. Workshops were held for this group on new applications programs (SPSS 6.0) and techniques for dealing with multivariate data. Additionally, council members exchanged teaching techniques and materials for use of ICPSR materials.

(2) Formal and informal workshops were given at local campuses by council representatives to disseminate information from statewide meetings and to acquaint interested faculty, students and administrators with ICPSR materials and on how to use them.

(3) Members of the council applied for federal grants for development of interdisciplinary learning modules utilizing ICPSR data (the outcome of this application is not known at this time). Additionally, new data sets were acquired in several areas including several data sets on criminal justice in California, a California general election data base, and an anthropology data base. These new materials were acquired through the efforts of TCSUC-ICPSR Council and its campus representatives.

(4) A well received activity of TCSUC-ICPSR Council was the spring undergraduate research conference held at Los Angeles State University. Despite the

fact that no statewide funding was available and the difficulties in scheduling, the conference was a first-time success. Some sixteen quality papers were accepted for presentation and an audience of several hundred students and faculty, as well as presenters, and TCSUC-ICPSR Council members participated. Evaluations given out at the conference were universally positive. (Note: A copy of the brochure for the conference, including paper topics and presenters, is included.)

(5) Summer Program--Several students and faculty were sent to Ann Arbor to participate in the Summer program. Complete financial support was not possible, but participants from San Francisco, Chico, San Luis Obispo, Sonoma, and Sacramento were granted some financial aid.

FUTURE PLANS

The Council in 1976-77 plans to continue its activities in developing and disseminating techniques for teaching and utilizing ICPSR materials. A workshop will be help dealing with faculty research and the undergraduate research conference will be repeated.

COMMENTS

The TCSUC-ICPSR Council is indebted to the personnel at the Chancellor's office and to the ISG personnel at the State University Data Center. The support of Mr. Charles Wilmot, Division of Academic Planning; Dr. Gene Geisler, Dr. David George, Mr. Mark Hayes, Mr. Hans Carter and the help of many others have made the success of TCSUC-ICPSR possible.
